OUR COMMITMENT

The overpopulation and suffering of homeless cats in our society demands a humane solution. Feral Cat Foundation (FCF) accepts the challenge to promote public recognition of this problem, to pursue workable solutions and, without euthanasia, to humanely reduce the population while improving the quality of life for these innocent victims of human neglect.



This year is the worst kitten season we have ever experienced. That’s true. But it was also true last year, and the year before, and the year before that. Despite the heroic efforts of the members of Feral Cat Foundation, kittens just keep coming. And it seems that each year they come earlier, and in greater numbers.

Our hotline is receiving as many as 30 calls daily about feral mothers in a yard with four to six kittens living under the bushes. These are the relatively easy ones. We know where the kittens are, we can pick them up, and then trap the mother. If the kittens are small, and still nursing, the family is reunited in a foster home until the kittens are weaned. At that point the kittens are usually very social, as the foster family has been working with them since their arrival. The mother is tested for disease, spayed, vaccinated, treated for fleas and worms, recovered, and returned to where she was trapped. The kittens will get the same treatment, and then placed into our adoption program.

It is much more difficult to deal with the feral mothers in parking lots, fields, and other inaccessible places. The mothers have so many places to hide her kittens, and the kittens, when they are brought to the feeding stations are difficult to catch. Ever try herding 6 kittens? These kittens, if young enough can often be socialized and put up for adoption. Otherwise, they are spayed and neutered and then returned to their original location.

One of our members was recently alerted to a small family living in a field. The three kittens were living under a large cement slab. Their diet consisted of whatever the mother could catch. All three kittens had serious eye infections, and were underweight. The foster started them on eye and oral medications immediately. The little ones were hissy spitty at first, but have calmed down considerably in the last three weeks. Their eyes are much improved, and they are gaining weight.

This story ended well. The kittens will go for adoption, the mother has been spayed and returned to her area, where she will be fed. Unfortunately, this is not always the case. We have picked up litters of kittens that were in serious trouble. Upper respiratory, eye infections, injuries to bodies and limbs. We have seen it all, and have dealt with whatever the need.

Feral Cat Foundation could not accomplish so much without the dedication of our members. At the same time, we so appreciate the continued support of our many donors. Your donation, which is tax deductible, enables us to help the cats in need, and to prevent more kittens from being born. 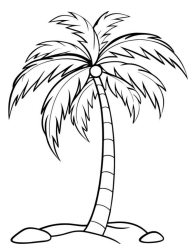
